RE: Future Shape consultation

I am writing to you with an update on the Future Shape consultation.

Quite a few members have asked why there has been so little reported as compared with Phase One.

The reason is really simple. There has been nothing to report because we have not had anything concrete to report back to members. Very little has been provided and the 7 Future Shape Groups (FSG) are only now producing material. You can view all the reports on our website here http://www.barnetunison.me.uk/?q=node/226. If you want hard copies please contact the UNISON office at contactus@barnetunison.org.uk or ring on 0208 359 2088/2090. The Councils intranet should have all the work plans, minutes of each FSG for staff to read.

We would encourage staff to take some time to read the updates from the Group Leaders.

For those who thought silence meant the Future Shape programme was going away I can report that it is still here and meetings are taking place.

Seven Future Shape Groups have been set up. Unfortunately despite our requests the Trade Unions are not part of these groups. It means that we are going to have to conduct our consultation second hand which is not best practice. We have raised this in a meeting with Councillors.

We have requested meetings with all the Group Leads and have asked that all work plans and data provided to the Groups are provided to the Trade Unions. Unfortunately we are having to play 'catch up' because some of the groups have already started.

What we need from you

We recognised that nothing stands still and we need to make sure our services and staff are fit for the future challenges. We are working closely with

Professor Dexter Whitfield who was part of the Newcastle success story (for details please contact the branch office).

We have devised Four Groups with a set of common questions and some questions specific for the each group. We recognise that our members have a breadth of knowledge and expertise which we want to use to help develop our/your proposals for the Future of Council Services.

Clearly it is difficult for some staff to attend meetings, which is why we are conducting this consultation. Please take some time to look at the questions and see if you are able to provide some responses and perhaps other questions and ideas. We have provided a Pre-paid envelope for you to reply. You can be assured that your contributions will be anonymised. We want to give an opportunity for the Trade Unions to table a report which reflects the input of our members to councillors on 8 June Cabinet Committee.

We can see only too well what sort of proposals can happen without staff involvement (read Essex flyer). The report going to 8 June Cabinet will identify perhaps clusters of services packaged together for particular models. Talk to your work colleagues if it helps provide a response, no service is immune to Future Shape; it doesn't matter if you work in children's, adults, resources, corporate governance, housing, environment. Essex is a stark reminder of that.

Team meetings

Add Future Shape to the Agenda for your team meetings. It really is important that as many of our members respond to this consultation. Take responsibility to bring information from the FSGs to the meeting and discuss it with your colleagues. Some of the work of the Groups will have a direct impact on your service and the work you do.

FREE Training opportunities

In the current economic climate, increasing employment it is clear we all need to make sure we have up to date training/qualifications. We are enclosing a questionnaire which we would like all our members to complete.

I look forward to receiving your comments. The deadline for responses to this consultation is Tuesday 21 April 2009.

We have devised Four Groups

- 2. Community need for public services
- 3. Improved coordination and shared services
- 4. Harnessing technology to improve service delivery

We have Common questions for all groups

- 1. What are your ideas for the future of your service or group of services, taking into account that you will not have access to significant additional resources in the near future?
- 2. What is the key change which will get your proposals implemented?

- 3. What changes are needed in the Council's organisational structure?

Remember Excelcare?


Essex County Council sold off their old people's homes to Excelcare.
